CODE OF CONDUCT

The Club Code of Conduct is included in registration materials and the Program Parent Guides. The Club takes the Code very seriously, and reserves the authority to enforce it in the best interest of the Club.

BUS TRANSPORTATION

The Afterschool Program provides transportation from the following schools:

Elementary: A. T. Allen, Boger, Carver, Coltrane Webb, The Daniel Academy, Patriots, R. Brown McAllister, Rocky River, Royal Oaks, W. M. Irvin, Weddington Hills, Winecoff, Wolf Meadow

Middle: Concord Middle, CC Griffin, JN Fries, Northwest Cabarrus Middle, Roberta Road Middle, Winkler Middle

High: Central Cabarrus, Concord High, Northwest Cabarrus, West Cabarrus High

- Parent must notify school of child's intention to ride the Club bus
- Child is responsible for getting to the bus immediately after dismissal
- Transportation is not provided when the Club is Closed
- If Cabarrus County Schools close early because of inclement weather, the BGC will also close and will NOT provide transportation

Children from all schools are welcome to participate, but transportation is only provided from the above schools. Non-bus riders may be dropped off during operating hours only.

AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAM

- Program is for youth in K-12th Grade
- Program operates Mon-Fri 3:30pm-7:00pm for Elementary, 4:30pm-7:00pm for Middle School, and 2:30pm-7:00pm for High School, R. Brown McAllister & Wolf Meadow Elem.
- Children must be in Kindergarten AND be 5 years old as of August 31, 2024
- Children are picked up from area schools and brought to the Club for a variety of activities
- Afternoon snack/dinner is provided and is included in the cost of the program
- School Closing Days are included in the cost of the program

SCHOOL CLOSING DAYS

The Club is open 7:30am to 7:00pm on many days the schools are closed. School Closing Days are included at no additional cost. Transportation is not provided on School Closing Days.

AGE GROUPS

Members are divided into age groups based on grade levels. All groups follow an activity schedule under the supervision of Club Staff.

DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP

CHILD DROP-OFF On School Closing Days, children may arrive anytime after 7:30am and must be picked up by 7:00pm. Drive-up drop-off is permitted only between 7:30am and 9:00am. Cars are not allowed to park in the drop-off lane. After 9:00am, parents must park and walk their kids inside to check in.

CHILD PICK-UP The parent/driver must come inside and report to the Club Central. Phone-in requests will not be permitted.

ACTIVITY ROOMS

Activity Rooms are divided into Junior (K-2) and Senior (3-5) wings. Each wing includes: Learning Center, Games Room, Multi-Purpose Room and Technology Center. Children also have access to 3 Gymnasiums and an E-Sports Room. Teens have designated rooms, outfitted with computers, televisions, video games, books and board games.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Power Hour Homework Club* helps Club members achieve academic success by providing homework help, tutoring and high-yield learning activities and encouraging members to become self-directed learners.

Smart Moves* is a prevention and education program addressing problems such as drug and alcohol use and premature sexual activity.

*Program members are required to attend Power Hour and SMART Moves sessions. Our Club receives grant money that has stipulations requiring Club members to attend these programs.

Keystone Club is an opportunity for high school students who wish to participate in service projects for the Club and the community.

SNACKS/DINNER

Afternoon snacks/dinner are provided each day through the Second Harvest Food Bank Kids' Café Program and NCDHHS Child and Adult Food Program. Children can bring their own snacks from home. Substitute foods to offset allergies are not provided.

PERSONAL ITEMS

The Club is not responsible for lost or stolen items. Valuables (cell phones, audio devices, handheld games, etc.) are prohibited, with the exception of high school students.
